

The Pipestone County Commissioners met for the annual Road and Bridge Hearing at the Mn Dot Conference Room. **CALL TO ORDER**

**COUNTY HIGHWAY ENGINEER DAVID HALBERSMA**

The Tentative 5 Year Construction Plan is also located on the Pipestone County website [www.pipestone-county.com](http://www.pipestone-county.com) Engineer Halbersma reviewed bridges and culverts in Pipestone County and their current construction status as well as a review of structural deficient bridges in the County.

**TENTATIVE 5 YEAR ROAD & BRIDGE PROGRAM**

County Engineer Halbersma reviewed the Tentative 5 Year Road Improvement Program.

County Engineer Halbersma reviewed the Tentative 5 Year Bridge Replacement and Improvement Program. Engineer Halbersma also reviewed structural deficient bridges in Pipestone County.

Engineer Halbersma presented two requests from Harvey Reder to extend blacktop on CR 67 in Woodstock 200 feet to the East and improve the narrow width and steep shoulders of CR 67.
